

JERRY SCHATZBERG DESIGNS THE POSTER FOR THE 32ND TORINO FILM FESTIVAL

The image symbolizing the 32nd Torino Film Festival is a precious gift from a great photographer and filmmaker: Jerry Schatzberg, the president of the jury in Turin in 2011.

Schatzberg is one of the leading figures of the **New Hollywood**, which the Festival is honoring with a retrospective that began in 2013 and will conclude at the 32nd TFF.

The photograph is a self-portrait from 1975, in which the filmmaker captured his own image in a shattered mirror.

Jerry Schatzberg was famous in the 1960s, with fashion shoots and photographs of celebrities published in Vogue, Esquire, Cosmopolitan and Time, but his fame became widespread in 1966 thanks to his memorable cover for Bob Dylan's "Blonde on Blonde" album.

In '75 he directed three movies: *Puzzle of a Downfall Child*, starring Faye Dunaway; *The Panic in Needle Park*, which launched Al Pacino's career; and *Scarecrow*, Palme d'Or in Cannes in 1973.

He is successful and indomitable. This photo is an artistic declaration and a manifesto: break with traditional values and rules, shatter the limits of the reproduced image, put yourself on the line and call yourself into question, go beyond, always.

A reference to the New Hollywood retrospective, certainly, but also a salute to the Torino Film Festival's constant search for innovation.



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
