Nicole, 41, begins a long relationship with an anonymous letterwriter, who sends her letters that change her life, but ultimately threaten everything that has meaning for her.

* Synopsis

Nicole, 41, is a pharmacist with a husband and two teenage kids, who is at a point in her life when she is asking if 'this is it,' or whether there's something more.

One day she gets a letter from an anonymous Observer who knows her daily habits, and her potential, intimately. He has a plan for her, if she is interested. The letter contains a green card that she should place in her window, if she wishes to pursue the mysterious relationship. If not, she should throw the letter away, and she will never hear from the Observer again.

After a few days of internal debate, she puts the card in the window and begins a long relationship with the elusive Observer, who puts her on a program that starts by changing her life, but ultimately threatens everything that has meaning for her.

Michelle Giroux (Nicole) has a long history of Shakespearian theatre. A mainstay at the Shakespeare festival in Stratford, she also has a long list of television credits. BLOOD PRESSURE marks her feature film debut.

Judah Katz (Michael) has been a mainstay of Canadian television programming since the early 80s. An award-winning performer, Judah's feature films include David Cronenberg's CRASH and opposite Kevin Spacey in CASINO JACK.

Tatiana Maslany (Kat) has been awarded at Sundance, the Toronto International Film Festival and around the world for her well crafted, profound perfomances. Most recently in VOW, but also in EASTERN PROMISES, VIOLET & DAISY and GROWN UP MOVIE STAR, among many many others, Tatiana showcases her ability to bring a role to life. * Director's statement

There is a moment in all of our lives when we ask ourselves "is this all there is?"

It's a moment when a door, that we didn't know was there, opens onto a different, possible life. Another life. Most of us are too scared to walk through that door, but we are all intrigued by where it might lead us.

That we are tempted to join the circus, fly into the desert at night, or follow instructions from a mysterious stranger that lead us into unknown intrigues, says something about the lives we live and the communities we have built to live them in.



Shooting BLOOD PRESSURE in Richmond Hill – a suburb north of Toronto – I was struck by the interplay of my characters and the suburb. I was struck by the profundity of the suburb as metaphor for a superstructure, into which we try and make our lives fit.

These places are crafted to protect us from the city, and from each other. There is a prescribed lifestyle inherent in the structure of a suburb that is meant to anticipate our every need, to alleviate anxieties prompted by uncertainty, and surround us with comforting curved lines of bays and crescents, the familiar green of manicured lawns and the hypnotic drone of lawnmowers singing in harmony.

They surround us so completely, that we need a map to find our way out. A map to a different life.

BLOOD PRESSURE is the story of a woman who receives that map in the mail one day.

Using a bare-bones, improvised approach I call 'Solo Cinema,' I shot my third feature, ZOOEY & ADAM in 2009, and I have further refined this methodology for BLOOD PRESSURE.

Having made three budgeted features with full crews, full tech complement, and all the lawyers, bonds, insurance people and union demands that come along with that, I was very interested in stripping it all away to allow time for meaningful collaboration with the actors, and time for them to focus on their performances in an intimate, low-pressure setting.

I am very proud of the result: remarkably intimate performances and raw emotional authenticity. I feel there are filmgoers who are ready to trade in commercial lighting, CGI babies, and wooden performances by superstar actors for something authentic: a sincere emotional experience at the cinema.

This is what I set out to create with BLOOD PRESSURE.



* Filmmaker biography

The press has referred to Sean Garrity's work as "possessing a dark, twisted beauty" (Janet Smith, Georgia Strait) and has compared his work to that of David Cronenberg (Globe and Mail) and even Luis Buñuel (Steve Palopoli, San Jose MetroActive).

His first feature film, INerTia, was awarded "Best First Feature" at the 2001 Toronto International Film Festival, and netted him "Best Director" at the 2001 FilmCan Festival. The Globe & Mail named him one of three "Canadian Filmmakers to Watch" in 2002 and Northern Life announced "Sean Garrity is the new wave of Canadian cinema."

His second feature film, Lucid, was one of the Top Ten Most Popular Canadian Films at the 2005 Vancouver International Film Festival, where it also won the CityTV award for best Western Canadian Feature, it was an Audience Award pick at Cinefest, and was an official selection at more than 25 film festivals around the world, including Shanghai, Mannheim, Singapore and Toronto.

His third feature, Zooey & Adam was shot entirely without crew or budget; a one-man film. It was awarded Best Experimental Film at the Pollygrind festival in Las Vegas, and nominated at the Vancouver International Film Festival for the CanWest award for Best Canadian Feature Film. It enjoyed a successful festival and theatrical release across Canada, and the critical response, so far, has been the best of Sean's career.

Sean's fourth feature My Awkward Sexual Adventure – premiered at the 2012 Toronto International Fillm Festival, played South America's only A-List film festival, Mar Del Plata, and won the Public Choice Award at the 2012 Calgary International Film Festival.

His fifth feature, Blood Pressure, one of only six Canadian films selected for the prestigious Busan International Film Festival, where it is singled out as one of Screen International's 10 Hot Films, will premiere there in October of 2012.

Both films are slated for 2013 theatrical releases.

In 2008, he was given a jury prize at the Brussels International Short Film Festival for his film ReOrder. In 2006, he was given the Special Jury Prize by the Don Haig jury at Toronto's Hot Docs Film Festival. The cash award is presented to a filmmaker whose work is not only outstanding, but has also bridged the documentary and fiction genres.

After spending years backpacking through Asia and South America, Sean returned to Winnipeg to begin a career as a filmmaker and musician in 1997, quickly creating award-winning music videos for Winnipeg artists including The Wyrd Sisters, Mark Reeves and Richard Moody. He also completed a number of documentaries, and award-winning short films. All nine of Sean's short films have international distributors and been sold to television around the world.

He first studied film production and theory at Toronto's York University and continued his studies at the Instituto de Arte Cinematografico de Avellaneda in Buenos Aires.

Sean also works as a bass player, having appeared on half a dozen CDs, and performs live most weekends in Winnipeg, where he lives.
