Between 1988 and the early 1990s, three events shook Armenia: a terrible earthquake, the Nagorno-Karabakh War and the break-up of the Soviet Union. As a consequence, part of the population chose to live in exile. The filmmaker follows the path of one of these men, recounting a deeply moving epic tale of an indocile man and an extraordinary storyteller.

Harutyun Khachatryan was born in Akhalkalak (Georgia). In 1981 he graduated from the Film Division of the Department of Culture of the Armenian State Pedagogical University. Between1981-1986, he worked as an assistant to director and film-director at the Armenian Documentary Studio and between 1987 - 2005 he worked in Hayfilm aka Armenfilm Studio as Director and Producer.

He directed films that were awarded prizes at various International film festivals.

In 2003, he received Armenian Government Award and obtained recognition as Honored Artiste of the Republic of Armenia.

Director of GOLDEN APRICOT FCD. Co-founder and the General Director of Yerevan International Film Festival GOLDEN APRICOT, since 2004.

He is a voting member of the European Film Academy, since 2006 and one of the founding members of Producers Association in Armenia, since 2007.

Harutyun Khachatryan was awarded with Prince Clause Awards in 2007 (official ceremony took place on 14th of December in Yerevan). In 2008, he became a Chevalier of the Order of Arts and Letters by the Ministry of Culture of France. In 2010, he was awarded the Rob Nilsson Award of the American Independent Filmmakers Alliance and the Darko Bratina Award. The same year Harutyun Khachatryan received an award from the RA President for his film Border.
