



Directed by Mikael Marcimain, one of Sweden's most celebrated and critically acclaimed directors, written by Marietta von Hausswolff von Baumgarten and starring up-and-coming faces as well as internationally-known talents, *Call Girl* has already managed to make a name for itself as one of this fall's most exciting premieres. Inspired by actual events surrounding the prostitution scandal that shook 1970's Sweden to the ground, *Call Girl* depicts an era of liberation and innocence, growing corruption and a cover-up that came to be known as the Watergate of Sweden.

Call Girl's Director of Photography, Hoyte van Hoytema — celebrated cinematographer of Let the Right One In, The Fighter and Tinker Tailor Soldier Spy — has a well established relationship with Marcimain, who also worked as a second unit director on Tomas Alfredsson's highly acclaimed Tinker Tailor Soldier Spy. Together they play a significant part in the new Swedish wave of filmmaking.

Call Girl is produced by Mimmi Spång, who was selected as Producer On the Move in Cannes 2011 with her colleague Rebecka Lafrenz. Recently they both were acknowledged for their work with the feature film Sebbe (2010), directed by Babak Najafi, which won Best First Feature Award at Berlin International Film Festival

SYNOPSIS

Stockholm, late 1970's. The model utopian society. Political neutrality and atomic power march hand in hand with women's liberation and the sexual revolution. But under the polished surface, other desires are eager to be fulfilled.

Within a stone's throw of government buildings and juvenile homes lies the seductive, glittery and dirty world of sex clubs, strip shows, discotheques and apartments used for illicit and profitable rendez-vous. 'Call Girl' tells the story of how young Iris is recruited from the bottom rung of society, into a ruthless world where power can get you anything.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

When I started working on *Call Girl* I thought I was doing a pure conspiracy thriller, strongly flirting with some of my favourite American films of the 70's. Very plot driven and inspired by a true political scandal in Stockholm in the mid 70's. In a way, everything was in the script, but the more I got involved in the process of researching, casting and later, shooting the film, I felt I had to get into the grey zones of all the characters in the plot, trying to give them as much depth as possible, letting them be contradictory, not clearly good or bad. Visually I was looking for something rough and close to skin but also glittery and colourful, with some sort of cinematic poetry. *Call Girl* is a story of lost innocence: the young girls', the police's, the politicians'. Weaving together multiple storylines to tell a larger tale of society and of humanity, it's a personal social thriller about Sweden in a time of sexual liberation and confusion.

DIRECTOR'S BIOGRAPHY

Mikael Marcimain's professional high profile stems from directing Sweden's highly acclaimed television series *The Laser Man* in 2005, a true story about a racist criminal, and *How Soon is Now* 2007, a fictional chronicle about four young friends' lives in the 60's and 70's.

Mikael started as an assistant director for SVT, where and later he got the chance to extend his scope. His breakthrough with the thriller TV-series *The Grave* got him the television award, Ikaros for best drama 2004.

Marietta is director and creative producer for KREV?! — a transmedia/feature film project introduced at Power to the Pixel — as she is also the Minister of Persuasion for the state of the Kingdoms of Elgaland-Vargaland (KREV) since 1996.

Marietta has worked as Script consultant for films such as Aditya Assarat's HI-SO, Hagar Ben-Asher's THE SLUT, Pernilla August's BEYOND and Aida Begic's DJECA (Children of Sarajevo).

CINEMATOGRAPHER HOYTE VAN HOYTEMA

Hoyte van Hoytema has twice won the Guldbagge award for best cinematographer. PRODUCER'S BIOGRAPHY

After graduating from the National Film School (Dramatiska Institutet) in 2001, Mimmi Spång, now co-owner of Garagefilm International, began to work at Memfis Film producing and production managing a number of films in the course of several years. Among others, Spång produced the much awarded short film, Viktor and His Brothers, by Mårten Klingberg. Furthermore she is the Excecutive Producer of Simon Staho's Heaven's Heart, which won an award at the annual Swedish Film awards "Guldbaggen" 2009. Spång also co-produced A Soap, by Pernille Fischer Christensen, which received the Silver Bear and Best First Feature in Berlin, 2006. In 2008 she produced Johan Jonason's feature Guidance, nominated for the Dragon Award at the Göteborg International Film Festival and the New Talent Award in CPH Pix. Her feature film Sebbe, directed by Babak Najafi, was nominated for the Dragon Award 2010 and was also awarded with Best First Feature Film at Berlinale 2010. In January 2011 Sebbe received a Guldbagge for Best Picture, and shortly thereafter Spång and her colleague Rebecka Lafrenz received the Lorens Award for best Swedish Producers 2010.
